Module Aim:		The aim of this module is to equip students with the ability to assess the nature of enterprise, its importance to the economy, its role in relation to innovation and its relevance in relation to career and lifestyle choice. It also aims to give the student the ability to assess the entrepreneurial personality, the creative & innovation processes and the need for industrial policy to create the necessary environment and support infrastructure for entrepreneurial activity. Furthermore, it challenges students to engage with small business issues and problems.
