Indicative Content

Creative Practice in Social Care Practice.

Creative methods that use tools like drawing and role-play to work with particular groups. Planning and facilitating creative arts activities with clients/service users. Reflect on creative thinking ability and creative leadership in carrying out creative activities. Pro: 5.1, 5.16.

Visual Art and Social Care Practice

Creative Art in Social Care - Art for Health and Well-being; art as a vehicle for self-expression, communication, healing and personal development. Understanding the universality of creative art expression, the language of art and the nature of artistic activity. Practice workshops develop student's understanding of the various art mediums and their uses. Pro: 5.1, 5.12, 5.16

Drama and Theatre Practices in Social Care Practice

Drama and theatre in the social care environment; Evidence based practice exploring social issues through theatre practices. Theory of Augusto Boal's Theatre of the Oppressed practical workshops. Pro: 5.1, 5.12, 5.16.

Creative Session Planning (Design & Preparation)

Students will prepare workshops within the class group, they will record and evaluate their facilitation practice while exploring the use of creative methodologies in a range of situations. They will engage in peer facilitation as a means of exploring and evaluating their role as a facilitator. Pro: 4.1, 4.2, 4.3, 4.4, 5.12, 5.16.
