<b>Initiation</b> Project goals/objectives/targets, project scope & planning assumptions. Project team, resource assessment, stakeholder & organisation assessment. Project governance & communication strategy, authorisation of scope-change, quality framework, control & review review procedure. Macro/micro environment & SWOT analysis.
<b>Planning</b> Work Breakdown Structure (tasks, dependencies/resources, sequence, estimates); Critical Path (high-level time-line scheduling); Gantt Chart (gantt planning & milestones, risk assessment and risk mitigation).
<b>Execution</b> Documentation Protocol (design process).
<b>Monitoring &amp; Control</b> Quality compliance to quality framework
<b>Termination</b> Report formatting, formal & technical language, notation and referencing. Summarisation techniques for recommendation & reporting.
